The Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses (ATCN) Provider Course is taught concurrently with the Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) for physicians. This course has been sanctioned by the Florida Committee on Trauma of the American College of Surgeons. This course was developed to teach established standards of trauma care and practical, life-saving skills.

The ATCN course is designed for the experienced nurse working in the emergency department, intensive care unit, surgical department and pre-hospital setting who wish to increase their knowledge and practical skills.

The course includes didactic presentations by ATLS physician instructors. Nursing skills practicum stations and moulage assessment stations are conducted by ATCN instructors for integration and application of didactic information,

Concept

Initial Assessment and management of the seriously injured patient ultimately influences the patient's final outcome. Specifically, knowledge of basic treatment principles of injury to the head, chest, abdomen or spine, can significantly reduce morbidity and mortality of trauma patients.

Objectives

The purpose of this course is to orient nurses to the initial assessment and management of the trauma victim. The content and skills are designed to help the nurse to assist the physician in providing the first hour of emergency care for the trauma patient. Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate concepts and principles of primary and secondary patient assessment.
- Establish management priorities in a trauma situation.
- Demonstrate management priorities of the trauma patient with multiple injuries.

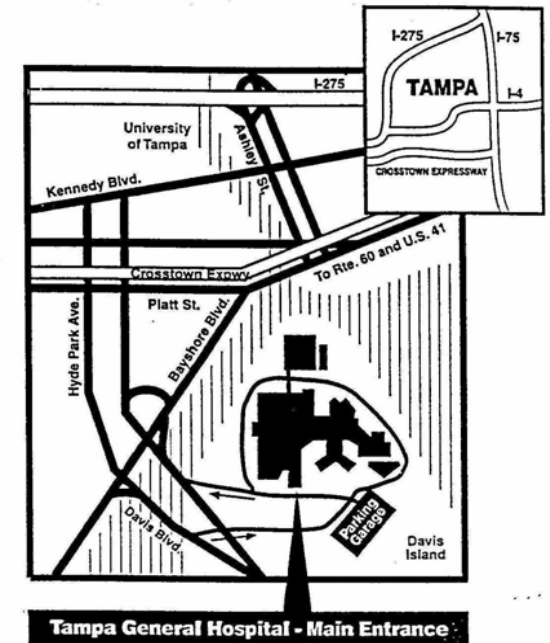
